## THANK YOU FROM THE HEADMASTER

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who have generously given to Stonyhurst in 2013 and 2014. We are grateful for your support of the Stonyhurst community which has enabled us to provide for our pupils even more effectively.

Philanthropy has played an important part in the history of Stonyhurst ever since the Weld family gifted the College buildings to the Jesuits in 1809. The Stonyhurst family including former pupils, former parents, current parents, staff, friends, Trusts and Foundations have continuously offered generous support through the many fund-raising campaigns and appeals which have been held.

Stonyhurst has an annual turnover of approximately £13 million and in 2013-14 the College successfully covered its costs with income. However, the College's income (from school fees and trading) is insufficient to fund major renovations or significant building projects, or indeed to extend our bursary programme. That is why we count upon the philanthropic support of the Stonyhurst family.

There are many different ways of supporting Stonyhurst, including offering financial support. Each year our Annual Fund identifies a number of projects for which we need to fund-raise. We are also running a "Subscription for Stonyhurst" bursary campaign which, in 2014, has attracted pledges of £200,000. A donation to Stonyhurst can be in the form of a regular gift each month, or a one-off gift. Some people also make a company gift or leave a legacy in their Will in favour of Stonyhurst. Whichever way you have chosen to give to Stonyhurst, the Governors, the staff and I are tremendously grateful. Thank you.

## ALTAR

An altar kindly donated by Mr & Mrs J Weld-Blundell has been installed in St Peter's Church. The altar was made in Paris in the late 19th century for a private home chapel.



On the owner's death the altar was acquired by Beaumont College and placed in the Stanislas Kostka chapel in their church. When Beaumont College closed in 1967 the altar was bought by John Weld-Blundell's mother. We are delighted to be able to continue the historical link with Beaumont College by housing this magnificent altar in St Peter's. We are very grateful for their generosity.



## LEGACY RECEIVED

We were delighted to have been able to commission a new memorial plaque in recognition of the support shown by the May family. They generously left the majority of their estate to the School. As per their wishes, in memory of their son Dominic, this has been used to help fund the refurbishment of the historic libraries and towards supporting our Bursary Programme. The plaque was unveiled at the beginning of 2014 in The Silence Gallery.

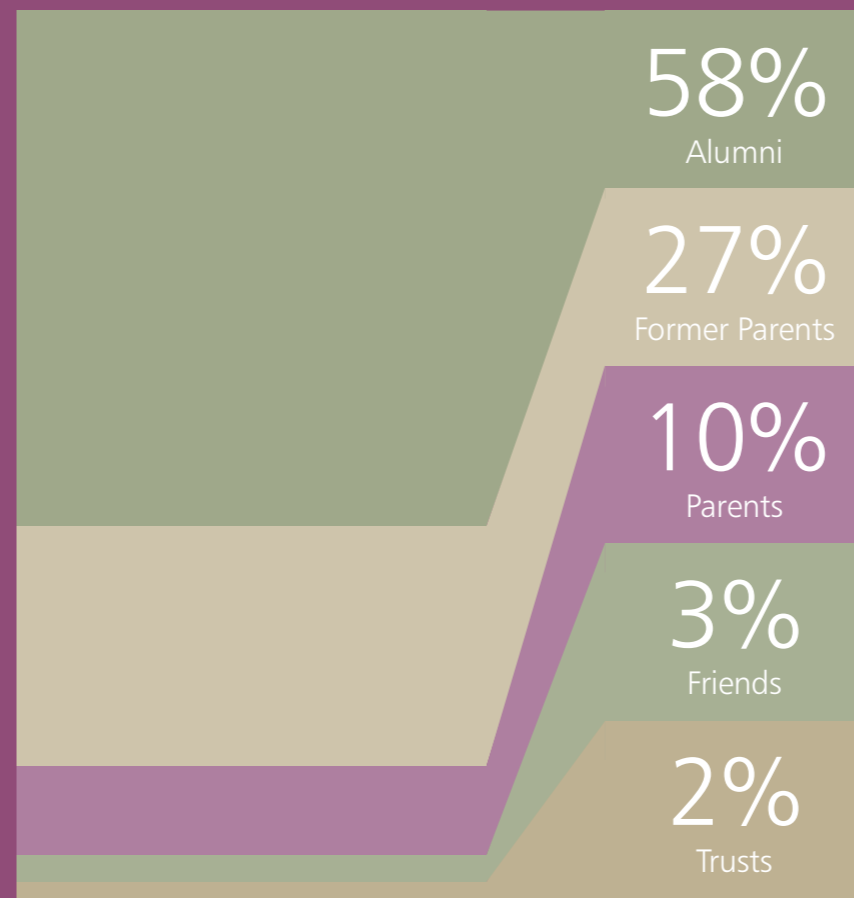
